PASTOR'S WORDS

There, at times, seems to be a romantic notion that peace is found far removed from society atop a hill in the distant landscape of solitude. From my perspective, this is not what John Wesley would have advocated. As active participants in the missionary movement that is Methodism, our mountain top must be in the mess of human interaction. I humbly believe, love is found in the relationships we form with fellow life, and peace is found in our unconditional expressions of love.

Attachment, for me, is emotional maturity, not spiritual immaturity, because God is attached to us in relationship. Our identity as Christians is found in the acts of service performed by our Savior, Jesus Christ. We can experience the beauty of meditation by attaching our thoughts to God. We can avoid succumbing to disillusionment by fixing our gaze towards the mysteries, revelations, and presence of God. We can experience the fruitfulness of Godcentered meditation because Christ demonstrated healthy prayer practices.

The Gospels describe Christ withdrawing for moments of private conversation with God, yet Christ always returned from his retreat to serve creation. Therefore, I believe detachment from the world shows thanklessness for the Creator, since the life that has been bestowed upon us and surrounds us is a gift from God. We can be discontent with the status of the world, while still being genuinely grateful to God for the generous gift of life.

Dorothy Day writes in *Loaves and Fishes* about the conflict that occurred between the philosophers and the laborers in the Catholic Workers Movement. I, too, recognize this tension within myself as I attempt to conceptualize the nature of God. I recognize that God is beyond what I can fully fathom. The philosopher within me sees this recognition as an invitation by God to ponder the Divine. Whereas, the laborer within me sees the same recognition of my inability to fully comprehend God as affirmation to focus all my efforts in serving those around me. This tension is a daily struggle for so many of us. Sharing with you in honesty, I admit that I do not always find harmony between the two.

When my homage to God in either thought or deed becomes stagnant or disingenuous I often return to 1 John 4:20-21,

[20] Those who say, "I love God," and hate their brothers and sisters whom they have seen, cannot love God whom they have not seen. [21] The commandment we have from him is this: those who love God must love their brothers and sisters also.

The willingness to worship the Creator without serving creation leads to a life of futility and emptiness. It is for 1 John 4:20-21 and our spiritual pilgrimage to experience a deeper, loving relationship with God that we strive to serve the left out, the lonely, and the "least of these" in our beloved world.

Dr. Clarke, my professor at Wesley Theological Seminary, instructed us every class to "never insult the poor." We must wash the feet of the tattered fringe most often forgotten by society. We must always show hospitality to those who are seen by society as the unraveled, hopeless heartbeats of our world. Those silent breaths have been given life by the Breath of God. They are the faces of God waiting to be welcomed as equals in the Body of Christ.

We must not be afraid to live by the Light while serving in the shadows of the World.




